Theme: "Supporting Mums Through Challenging Times"





Basics of SPSS for Healthcare Professional

Theme: "Empowerment of healthcare professionals with statistical

knowledge and skill"

Objective of the Activity were to 1) Discuss the nature, purpose, and types of statistics available for analysing data, 2) Identify the meaning of data cleaning, 3) Determine when the paired t-test is appropriate to use, 4) Use SPSS to compute a paired t-test, 5) Introduce the analysis of variance, 6) Use SPSS to obtain a cross-tabulation table, 7) compute the associated statistics and interpret the results, and 8) write up the results of a cross-tabulation analysis for presentation

and publication.

This workshop was very successful and favourable by participants based on their evaluation. Participants requested for more future workshop including advanced statistics and exercises. The recommendation to conduct the workshop in two days to accommodate the practice sessions.









Professional Resilience and Publishing Journal Article

This activity aimed to 1) demonstrate understanding of the process of journal article publication, 2) plan for successful publication process, 3) apply the principles of responding to the reviewer's comment, 4) understand the theory of resilience in health care and educational context, and 5) recognize the importance of building a professional resilience.

The Continuing Education and Orientation Committee conducted the Faculty need assessment for the forthcoming academic year. Based on the assessment, the committee prioritized to take up the topic addressing Professional

Inspire Webinar Series



mean and how to earn it?"




