



The program was evaluated in three major areas namely, Content, Presentation and Professional application.




Majority (>60%) of the target group found the content covered in the program to be useful, adequate, relevant and well organized.

Brief Summary of the event:

The event was organized in collaboration with the administration of Al Fikriya School. Ms. Lina Shakman gave a brief inaugural lecture on Diabetes and Its management during the morning assembly.

Health education was planned for the target group in the foyer of the school. Exhibits and posters on diabetes, causes, prevention, and management were displayed and explained to the group by the nursing students. Healthy and unhealthy food for diabetes was displayed for the group to have clear understanding.

Random blood glucose screening and weight checking

	was done for the faculty, staff of Al Fikriya School, parents of children and few students of the school. Teachers of the school brought the high-risk students for blood glucose screening. 90 members were screened including 35 faculty and staff, 35 students and 20 parents. The screening session was followed by a three round walkathon led by Ms. Deepa Thomas. Students and Faculty of the school participated in the healthy walk to establish the importance of daily exercise in the prevention and management of Diabetes. The nursing students arranged an interactive awareness program for senior children of the school. The session involved education through play method. Children from the school were encouraged to participate and learn through group interaction. All children who participated in the program were given individual gifts and token of appreciation. At the end of the program, administrator of the school appreciated the efforts take by team members and acknowledged the same by awarding certificate of appreciation.

1. First aid workshop:

With the aim of spreading awareness about the first aid skills in the management of the emergencies, the nursing group has organized its First Aid workshop on the 8th of October .The 156 participants in the workshop were from various professions and majors.

The skills that were practiced during the workshop were; first aid skills in the management of fractures ,burns , wounds , suffocation , and cardiac arrest (CPR). Moreover, a theoretical session was conducted about the management of hyper and hypoglycemia, and epilepsy.

Limitations and challenges of the activity:

The time of first aid workshop is short it is 2 hours and 30 min, but there are many skills we want to discuss with the participants.

Recommendations:

Next time we should do it at least in 3 hours.

2. Oman Science Festival:

Nursing group participate in Oman Science Festival, which was hold it in Oman Exhibition Hall from 26 to 28 October 2017. It is organized by the Ministry of Education in cooperation with Sultan Qaboos University.

Our participation was especially about the first aid practices, such as: suffocation station, CPR, burns station, wounds and fracture station. There are many visitors to our stations among students from different schools, university students, colleges, staff and families, and there was a great interaction by visitors during the three days of the festival.

لاقت محطات القافلة اصداء وتفاعل رائع ف مختلف محطاتها . كما تم استضافة رئيس الجماعة الطالب خالد الحوماني في برنامج قهوة الصباح للحديث عن فعاليات القافلة المختلفة . وايضا تم نشر مقال صحفي في جريده الشبيبة عن القافلة.

ورشة الإسعافات الأولية:

نظمت جماعة التمريض بجامعة السلطان قابوس ورشة الإسعافات الأولية يوم الأحد 10 أكتوبر 2017 . و قد هدفت هذه الورشة إلى زيادة الوعي الصحي خلال الحالات الطارئة لأفراد المجتمع، حيث فتحت الورشة أبوابها للأفراد من داخل و خارج الجامعة.

بدأت الورشة بعرض نظري الذي نوقش فيه عن اللدغ ولسع الحشرات التي تعد أحد المشاكل الصحيه الشائعة التي يتعرض لها الفرد في حياته. عقب ذلك تم تقسيم المشاركين الذين بلغ عددهم إلى ما يقارب 156 مشارك إلى مسارات مختلفة تمر بمحطات عديدة. قسمت هذه المحطات إلى : محطة الإنعاش القلبي الرئوي (CPR) الذي تحدث فيها المقدمين إلى طريقة الصحيحة لعملية إنعاش القلب خلال إصابات مختلفة ،كما استعرض المقدمين من خلال المحطة عن أحد الإصابات الرياضية الشائعة التي قد تسبب الوفاة و هي بلع اللسان و الطريقة الصحيحة لإسعاف الشخص، أما المحطة التالية وتضمنت طريقة إسعاف الكسور الذي تحدث المقدم فيها عن الأنواع المختلفة للكسور و طرق المختلفة لتثبيت الجزء المكسور. كما ركزت أحد المحطات على إسعاف الحروق و الجروح التي قد يستخدم فيها معظم أفراد المجتمع طرق غير مثبتة علميا للإسعاف.

الجدير بالذكر أنه تم التركيز في هذه الورشة على الجانب العملي لضمان حصول المشاركين على المعلومات بالشكل الصحيح، و تمكنهم من تطبيقها في الحالات الطارئة، كما ركزت أيضا على البدائل من الأدوات المتاحة، بحيث يستخدم الشخص ما هو متاح أمامه لإسعاف المصاب. تم منح المشاركين في الورشة شهادات مشاركة بالإضافة الى كتيب تعليمي خاص بالإسعافات الاولية وايضا حقيبة اسعافات اولية .


